Questions

Did you enjoy the film? What events, characters or scenes particularly stood out for you?

How do you believe God can work in the hearts of those who don't believe in Him?

One of the aspects of a relationship with God the the film examines is how dysfunctional family relationships can sometimes hinder a belief in God. How do you think our family relationships can affect our faith in God?

Intentionally sharing our faith enriches us as a community and also enables us to experience community in the way that God intended (**Acts 2:42-47**) by being vulnerable with each other. Did you find Lee Strobel's journey through doubt toward faith encouraged you in your own faith?

Have you ever thought about the facts surrounding the crucifixion and resurrection? Is the film successful in proving the story and witness of Jesus to be true?

Have you had an opportunity to share with others how you became a Christian? In your group if you feel able, share your conversion story or how you came to know Christ and have a relationship with Him.
